2011 Pennsylvania Fire Convention Hands – On Training Class Descriptions

Fire Service Torch & Saw Use

This program will educate firefighters on the capabilities and limitations of metal cutting devices being carried on their apparatus to be used during proactive and reactive firefighter rescue situations. Students will learn safe use & practices during emergency situations requiring metal cutting operations. Students will rotate through several skill stations learning the uses of metal cutting saws and torch cutting systems.

SCBA Confidence

Every firefighter must know how to be proficient and confident in the use of their SCBA as well as know how to overcome fire ground emergencies that they may be confronted with. Students will learn to identify situations that get firefighters trapped or killed, how to take measures to avoid these situations, and learn survival procedures. Techniques learned will include Mayday vs Urgent Transmissions, Dis-Entanglement techniques and SCBA confidence skills.

Engine Company Operations – Live Fire

Students that attend this program will be given the opportunity to learn basic and advanced fire attack techniques to enhance their engine Company tactics on the fire ground. Proper line selection, hose loads and stretches, various nozzle techniques and attack procedures will be delivered through scenario based training under live fire conditions. This is a must for all firefighters as the operations of the engine company is one of the most critical functions on the fire ground.

Firefighter Personal Escape Options

Any firefighter engaging in fire ground operations must have a solid foundation developed in emergency escape procedures. This program will cover the several options that firefighters can utilize to safely egress upper floor entrapments. Techniques from simple to enhanced such as the hang and drop, ladder slide, body wrap, along with the adaption of the personal escape system will be covered. Firefighters attending will leave with an increased knowledge of fire ground safety and self-rescue options.
